Barbados: The Britannia's (1852-1878)

Have you ever thought it interesting to be a real sleuth? The Barbados Britannia's offer this opportunity. The identification of the correct stamps for each issue requires some real detective work. The following considerations are to be taken into account:


- 1. **Color** even at the beginning this became a major problem because there were no denominations on the earliest issues. The 1st Issue Two Pence Purple looked more like slate blue making it difficult to distinguish from the One Penny Blue. Also, in later issues shade variation was obvious, especially when multiple printings of an issue occurred. And to compound the problem, over time some of the inks used had a tendency to cause the stamp colors to fade.
- 2. Paper there are several considerations involving paper determination.
 - a. **Bluing** whereby paper reacted with prussiate of potash in the ink to cause a bluing effect on the 1st Issue. This is the major determinate between the 1st and 2nd Issues.
 - b. **Perforations** this is the most difficult area of identification for the early issues. The early machinery was not precise and was subject to variation due to its manufacture with hand inserted pins.
 - c. Watermarks Perkins Bacon had the original contract to print Barbados stamps beginning in 1851. The earliest issues were unwatermarked. Later issues had two types of "star" watermarks described as "large star" and "small star". Collectors have difficulty in distinguishing between the two types because the stars were constructed by handbent wires and the "small stars" were sometimes nearly as large as the "large stars." In 1874 the contract was given to De La Rue. All Britannia's printed by De La Rue were on paper watermarked "(Crown)/CC".
 - d. **Density** the paper thickness varied from very thin to very thick. On very thick paper watermarked issues this makes watermark determination difficult.

This exhibit addresses the above characteristics in chronological order by issue. The postal markings are an area of interest and are shown in this exhibit. There were two types of obliterators, oblong and later on those known as "bootheel". Numbers were assigned to each parish on the island, there being eleven parishes. The challenge is to try and collect cancels from each parish for each issue. Some of the parish numbers are quite elusive. A good representation of these cancels is shown herein.

Barbados is the most easterly of the Caribbean Islands. It is a small island, being only 21 miles long and 14 miles wide at its widest point near the southern end.

The total area is 166 square miles. The principal towns are

Bridgetown (capital), Holetown (St. James Parish) and Speightstown (St. Peter Parish).

Watermarks

Perkins, Bacon & Co.

Although Perkins, Bacon & Co. used watermarked paper for stamps from 1854, it was not until 1870 that they printed stamps for Barbados with watermarked paper. There were two types as shown below, each star designed for a specific size stamp. However, sometimes the right paper was not available making it possible to find both types of star watermarked paper used for the same size stamp design.

Paper used for the Perkins Bacon & Co. printings was supplied by the T.H. Saunders Co., London.

Stamps can be found with parts of the private watermark.

De La Rue & Co.

De La Rue & Co. was given the contract by the Crown Agents to print stamps for Barbados in late 1874. De La Rue & Co. was using (crown)/"CC" watermarked paper for printing all colonial stamps. The Britannias printed by De La Rue & Co. were from Perkins, Bacon & Co. plates. The stamps of the Halfpenny, One Penny, There Pence and Four Pence were printed in panes of 120 stamps (10 rows by 12 columns). The watermark was positioned so that it aligned properly with one impression per stamp on these panes. The stamps of the Six Pence and One Shilling were printed in panes of 110 stamps (11 rows by 10 columns); therefore, the paper had to be turned sideways so that it aligned properly with one watermark per stamp on these panes. Thus, the Six Pence and One Shilling are always found with the watermark sideways.

Obliterators (oblong marks)

The first postmarks of the INLAND Post Office were oblong marks of three top horizontal lines and four bottom lines, with two vertical lines on each side, normally enclosing the Parish Post Office Numbers 2, 3, 4, 10 and 11. Parish numbers 1, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 have the bars inverted. These obliterators were in use from 1852 to 1863.

Every year new information and new listings are added to the Scott Classic Specialized Catalogue of Stamps and Covers 1840-1940.

Stamp images in the 2002 edition of the Scott classic specialized catalog are dramatically improved. Most of the images in the catalog are shown as actual stamps, with margins and perforations, within a thin black border.

"Since its inception in 1995, the Scott classic specialized catalog has provided an ever-expanding volume in which collectors and dealers will find a wealth of worldwide stamp and cover information all in one place," according to Scott catalog editor James Kloetzel.

The Scott classic specialized catalog, which also lists British Commonwealth stamps through 1952 or 1953, includes listings for covers; forerunner issues; minor lettered listings for shades, perforation varieties, paper varieties, watermark varieties and overprint/surcharge varieties; bisects on cover; listings for never-hinged and no-gum stamps; plate and printing varieties; multiples; specimen stamps and more.

Additions to the 2002 Scott

classic specialized catalog include several new major Scott numbers.

In Barbados, an 1859 (½-penny) pale yellow-green pinperforated gauge 14 by 12½ Britannia issue is inserted as Scott 12B. This rare stamp is valued at \$3,250 in used condition and is dashed in the unused column (the dash meaning that it exists unused but cannot presently be valued).

In Bermuda, the 1936 12/6p postal fiscal is listed as Scott AR1.

Eleven new military stamps are listed in Egypt for the 1932-35 British Forces in Egypt issues, Scott M1-11. Previous numbers M1-4 are renumbered as M12-15.

And in Somaliland Protectorate, the 1909 ½-anna bluish green is reinstated as Scott 49.

Forerunner listings are added for Bangkok (Straits Settlements used in Bangkok), British East Africa (India used in Mombasa, July-October 1890), Brunei (the 1895 issue), Cape Verde (British postal agency in San Vicente) and South Africa (British stamps used in South Africa during the Boer War).

The new Scott classic specialized catalog contains more than 150 countries with at least some cover listings.





Issue 7 - Paper Watermark: Small 6 point Star

Stamps with the Small Star watermark were issued by Perkins, Bacon & Co., London on paper similar to that of the unwatermarked paper of previous issues.

The paper was supplied by the firm of T. H. Saunders & Co., London.

The star measures 12 to 13½ mm from point to point and on 24mm centers vertically. It was first used for the Queensland stamps sent out on August 16, 1860.

In the Fall of 1871, Perkins, Bacon & Co. began use of this watermarked paper for subsequent issues of Barbados stamps. The small star is supposed to be placed so that one impression is centered on each stamp of a sheet of 110 stamps (11 rows of 10 stamps per row). This watermark saw limited use on Barbados stamps as it was discontinued in 1873.

The Small Star paper was supposed to be under tight security as it was used under Government contract; however, this example escaped detection.
