NUMERICAL OBLITERATOR A32 TYPE 'H'

This obliterator was in use at Buff Bay from 1st March, 1859 until at least 14th March, 1892 as per cover of that date which was part of the Ian Woodward exhibition (Exploring Jamaica through Obliterators). Buff Bay is a small village in Portland Parish on the North Coast Road. The post office there opened in 1788 but it did very little business until 1873 when the salary of the then postmistress was doubled. In later times it became prosperous due to the warehouses, wharves and stores of the Boston Fruit Company.
