NUMERICAL OBLITERATOR TYPE A34H

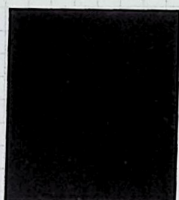
The obliterator type A34H was in use at Claremont between 1859 and 1890. It is situated on the A1 road between St. Anne's and Spanish Town, some eleven miles inland in the parish of St. Ann. It was established at a place which rejoiced in the curious name of Fingerpost. The post office there opened in 1852. The first postmaster, Robert Robinson, was paid £6.0.9d per annum.

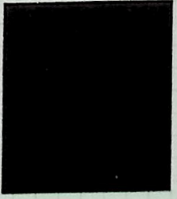
