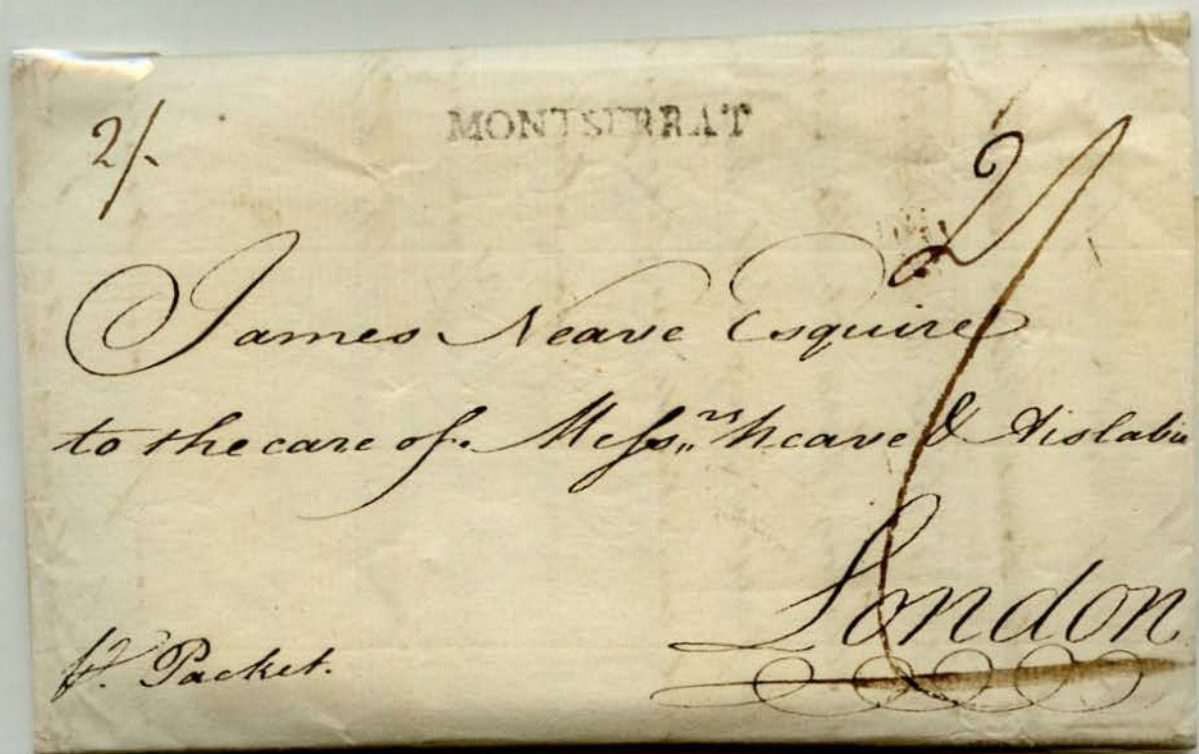


MONTSERRAT

1794 January 6th entire letter and outer wrapper of a letter from Richard McNamara on Montserrat to James Neave in London endorsed 'P(er) Packet Straight line 'MONTSERRAT' (40x4mm) manuscript '2/-' charge arrival mark of 17th April



In a long letter, McNamara explains the poor local situation which has resulted in having to 'feed the Negroes very high..... I never knew such dreadful times for the blacks and Whites.

MONTSERRAT

1793 October 4th entire letter from Richard McNamara Montserrat to James Neave
in London endorsed 'P(er) Packet Straight line 'MONTSERRAT' (39x4mm)
Manuscript '1/--' charge arrival mark of 22nd November



McNamara reports that the estate is doing well although subject to an infestation of borers in the sugar cane and some rats. The new overseer, Mr Allers, has applied for an increase in his salary and comments that "Your Negroes are very healthy considering the times & your cattle are in good order & condition but I am sorry to inform you that we have lost one of the new Negroes last month

BARBUDA



1742-1743 Entire Letter written from Barbuda to Dodrington. It was in three parts
The first dated December 31st 1742 gives an account of the local conditions and exports for
the previous six months. The second part is undated and the third is dated 16th April 1743
The letter addressed to Lady Codrington is from Simon Punter who was the agent for the
Codrington family who owned the entire island.
The earliest recorded letter from the island.
