










First Day Caver

The stamps and the first day cover for this Christmas issue were designed by Jennifer Toombs. She used a theme based on religious paintings from 15th century by the Italian artists Perugino (1446-1523) for the 3c and 21c, using his Adoration of the Shepherds – Musée des Beaux-Arts, Rouen. France, and Ghirlandaio (1449-1494) for the 8c and 18c, using his Adoration of the Magi – Uffizi Gallery, Florence, Italy.





Dear Mrs. Goaman,

Further to your visit to this office on 4th November, I take pleasure in confirming that you have been commissioned to prepare designs for a special issue of Cayman Islands postage stamps depicting "Wild Orchids".

This series will consist of four values, namely $\frac{1}{4}$ ct, 2 ct, 10 ct and 40 ct. Each design should include the territorial name "CAYMAN ISLANDS", the Royal Cypher, the value tablet and the appropriate botanical name for each design. The size of the stamps will be 1.12" x 1.6765" perforation to perforation and your artwork should therefore measure 4.04" x 6.266".

The designs are to be selected from the list of "Cayman Native Orchids" forwarded to us by the Cayman Islands, a copy of which was handed to you for reference.

As agreed during the course of our discussion on this subject. your fee will be £60. per design or a total of £240. for four pieces of finished artwork on the understanding that you should be prepared to amend the designs with no additional cost to our Principals should the Palace or the postal authorities in the Cayman Islands request certain modifications to be made to the artwork.

Your concern over completing the designs at the earliest possible date is much appreciated and I am grateful that you will do your utmost to complete the finished designs by early December.


