BWISC Convention 2013 Informal Display By James Podger CAYMAN ISLANDS POSTAL STATIONERY

The postal stationery issued between 1908 & 1911 was the first such material issued by the Cayman Islands. It was all printed by De La Rue. The first order, for 1044 ¼d postcards, was ordered on requisition 22/08 of 6 June

1908. These postcards are found in two different sizes, 121mm x 75mm & 115mm x 89mm.



The above stationery card was sent from George Town, with a Type 4 cancel dated OC 20 08. It bears a Kingston, Jamaica transit cancel, dated NO 4 08. The rate to the USA was 1d, but as no Farthing stamps were available the card is over-rated by 1/4d.


Card used during the second manuscript period.

¼d card, sent from Georgetown, with a Type 5 cancel, dated JA 21 10 to London. There is no message, so the card should have attracted the ½d printed matter rate. It shows a 'T' enclosed in a circle, with manuscript 5. It also has the ½D F.B. postage due strike applied in London.
This is the only recorded ¼d stationery card, which has not been up-rated when sent overseas, and the only one with postage due markings.



The addressee, Mrs Hirst, is the wife of the Commissioner.





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

There were four requisitions for the ¼d postal stationery card between 6June 1908 and 13 July 1910, but only one requisition for the other postal stationery: ½d wrapper 23 April 1909; 1d card and 1d envelope15 October 1909; 2½d envelope 24 September 1911.
