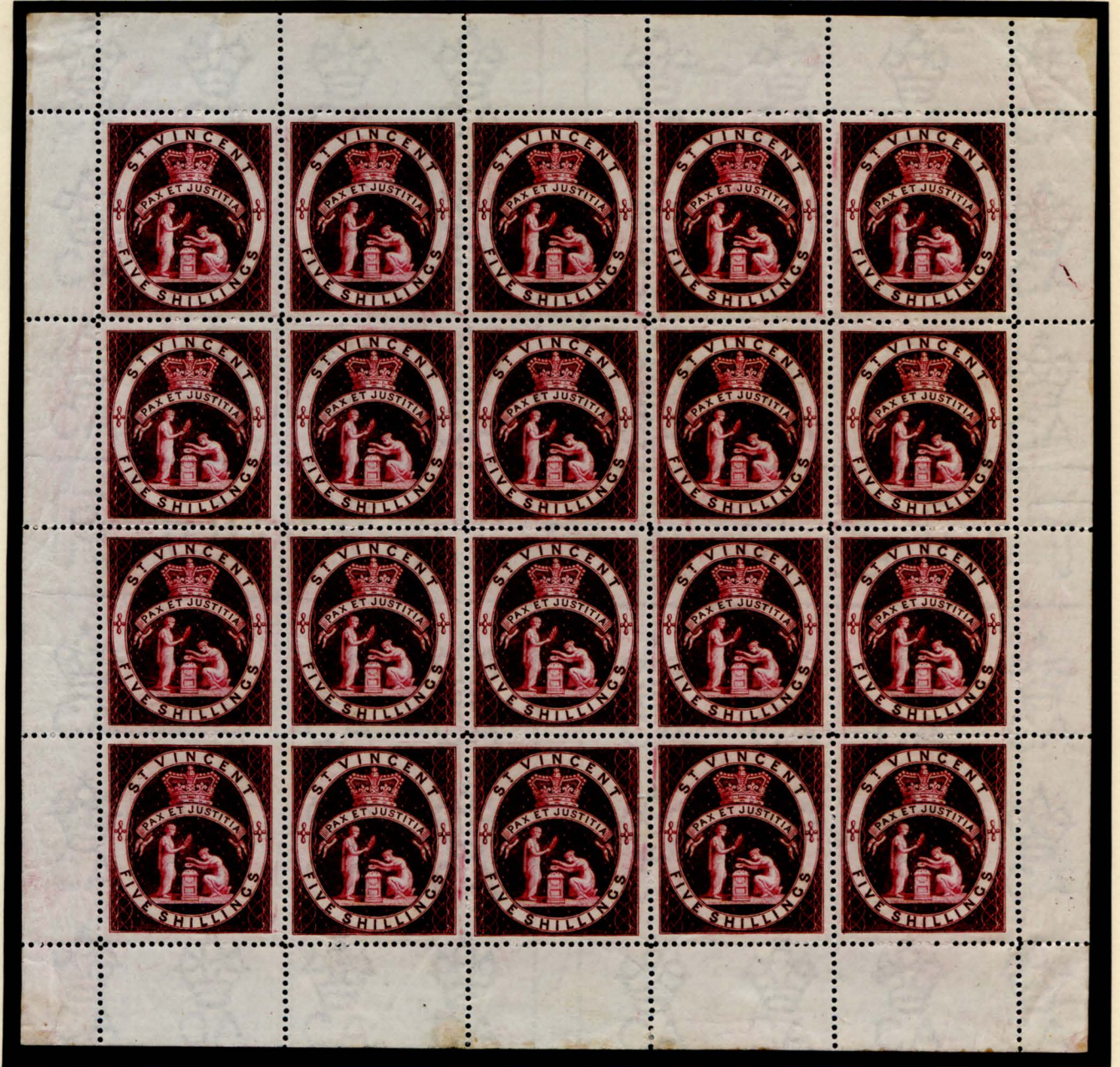

PML (p. 150) "The next printing, nos. 27 and 29 are of particular interest and the first date of use noted is November 1894. The surcharges are the same type as No. 8. As the £50 duty had been repealed in 1886 it is unlikely that there is any connection between the £1 and the £10 and the £50 value. Probably 27 and 29 were provisionals made after the stocks of nos. 26 and 28 were used and prior to the issue of nos. 51, 52 and 53."
