NOTE (a).—If the Homeward Mails, &c., are embarked in time, and the Packet be in all other respects ready, she may start from Colon the previous evening, but the departure from Jamaica homeward is not to be accelerated, unless from Quarantine or other causes the Packet may have to coal at another Port, in which case she may leave Jamaica as soon as she is ready.

NOTE (b).—If either of the Steamers on the Branch Routes has not reached Barbados, the Packet is to await the arrival of the missing vessel two clear days, if necessary; otherwise the Packet is to start for England the moment the Mails, &c., from the several Branch Packets and from Barbados have been received on board, and she is in all respects ready for sea.

NOTE (c).—Should the tide not suit for leaving Demerara at the hour appointed in this Table, the Packets may leave at any earlier hour at which the tide may suit.

Where the time specified for arrival at a Port is after dark, the Packet may remain outside the Harbour until daylight; and as regards St. John's (Antigua), unless the Packet arrives in time to admit of her leaving so as to get well clear of surrounding dangers during daylight, she may remain till the following morning.

SEALED TENDERS for the privilege of advertizing in all the Railway Stations for a period of three years, commencing 1st July, 1885, and ending 30th June, 1888, will be received by the Acting Colonial Secretary up to 12 o'Clock, noon, on SATURDAY, THE 20TH JUNE.

The person to whom this privilege shall be let shall have the exclusive right of sub-letting on his own terms to those who may wish to affix Placards or Advertizements. But this right shall not prevent the Railway affixing Railway Notices regarding alteration of Trains, or Excursion Trains, Time Tables or Notices calling attention to Bye-Laws, &c.

The Contractor will be bound under penalty of forfeiture of Contract to submit all advertizements for the approval of the General Superintendent before they are affixed in any Station.

All advertizements are to be framed and fixed to the walls of the Stations by screws. Nails will not be allowed, nor is an Advertizement to be posted on the walls of the Stations with paste or glue.

The tenders should state the amount the Contractor is prepared to pay quarterly in advance.

doubled that of 1874 it is beyond contention that all the roads are in a better condition now to what they were prior to the Public Works Department having charge of them.

The maintenance of roads in Trinidad will always appear high and as far as can be foreseen it will always be so, or at all events for many many years to come. For it is not likely that permanent bridges will replace the timber ones except by degrees. The chief causes that make maintenance high are:—

- 1st Owing to there being so few quarries of good material for road making, cartage and transport must be an expensive item. The cost of cartage, &c., in 1884 was £9,379 or over one-fifth of the total expenditure on roads and bridges.
- 2nd As there are still over 820 timber bridges the mere item for their yearly repair is a heavy expense, leaving alone the rebuilding as the main timbers decay.
- 3rd Owing to a tropical climate grass grows not only more rapidly, but almost all the year round, and the item "cutlassing," alias mowing, which is almost unfelt in a colder climate, becomes a heavy item. For this year's estimate "cutlassing" appears as £3,821 or £4 7 0 a mile.

Village streets were included in the expenditure of roads till January, 1881, when the supervision of them reverted to the Wardens. The cost of their maintenance from that year has not therefore been included in this Report.

WORKS AND BUILDINGS.

Rebuilding the Port-of-Spain Police Barracks after the fire was commenced in 1882 and completed in 1884 at a cost of £15,452. The concrete floors for the upstairs galleries and court house, with the iron staircases, render the building more substantial and less liable to fire than it was with the wooden floors and staircases.

The Diego Martin Police Station, which had been commenced in 1883, was completed in 1884 at a cost of £708.

The alterations of the Store Room, San Fernando Hospital, were completed at a cost of £398.

The Mayo Schoolhouse, begun in 1883, was completed in 1884 at a cost of £524.

The New Government Offices, begun in 1883, were completed in 1884—£4024.

The General Post Office, begun in 1883, was completed in 1884—£1847.

Repairs to the Public Bath House in 1884—£431.

Repairs to Fort George Signal Station in 1884—£491.

The San Fernando Post Office began in 1884, but was not completed during that year.

The San Fernando Wharf Extension cost during 1884—£8810.

Repairs executed under Estimates—£5062.

Repairs executed as Petty Repairs—£1469.

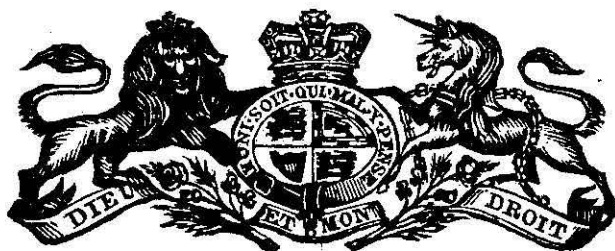
PORT-OF-SPAIN WATERWORKS.

The Waterworks dam at Maraval was examined and repaired early in 1875, since which time it had not been found necessary to shut off the water from the town until the 12th of the present month, when the long continued dry season necessitated the closing of the main valves in the town, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., each day.

The wet season which has now apparently set in will allow of the continuous supply being resumed at an early date.

Since the commencement of 1884 a considerable extension of the main supply pipes of the above works has been carried out.

The previous faulty construction of the system in the town (due not to the original design but to an additional 12 inch main laid in a few years afterwards) by which the two main pipes from Maraval Reservoir, 12 inch and 10 inch respectively were constricted into a single 10 inch main in Prolongation of Clarence Street has been altered, and instead of a single main pipe down Clarence, St. James, and Frederick Streets from which the whole supply of the town had to be drawn, there are now 3 main pipes or arteries supplying the different sub-mains by means of which the water is more equally distributed and the supply to the outlying districts which was previously very deficient has been greatly improved.

PARCEL POST

BETWEEN

UNITED KINGDOM AND TRINIDAD.

ON and from 1st October next, Parcels not exceeding 7 lbs. in weight will be received at the General Post Office, Port-of-Spain, up to 4 p.m. on the day preceding the departure of the outward English Mail for transmission to any part of the United Kingdom.

In the reverse direction, Parcel Mails from the United Kingdom will be conveyed to this Country by Royal Mail Steamers arriving every alternate Friday.

The following are the Special Regulations and Conditions to be observed:—

RATES OF POSTAGE.

For a Parcel:—

Not exceeding 1 lb. in weight...8d.

For each pound or fraction
of a pound additional.....8d.

These rates to carry the Parcel to destination in United Kingdom without further Postage.

DIMENSIONS.

The dimensions allowed will be:—

Greatest length3ft. 6ins.

Greatest length & girth
combined.....6 0

PREPAYMENT.

The postage must in all cases *be paid in advance*, and by means of postage stamps which must be affixed by the Sender. No parcel will be accepted for transmission which is not sufficiently prepaid.

ADDRESS & MODE OF POSTING.

Each parcel must be plainly directed. Such direction setting forth the name and full address of the person for whom the parcel is intended. It should bear the words "Parcel Post" in the upper left hand corner, and the name and address of the Sender. The date of posting should also be added. A parcel must not be posted in a letter box, but must be taken to the General Post Office, Port-of-Spain, and presented at the counter.

CUSTOMS DECLARATION.

Parcels will be liable to Customs duties and regulations, and the Sender of each parcel will be required to make a Customs declaration furnishing—upon a special form provided for the purpose, and which can be obtained at the General Post Office, Port-of-Spain—an accurate statement of the contents and value, the date of posting, and the Sender's Signature and place of abode. Customs duties will be collected on delivery.

FORBIDDEN ARTICLES.

No Parcel containing dangerous Articles, Perishable Articles, Articles likely to injure other Parcels. Liquids (unless securely packed in proper cases) opium, or other Contraband Article or Substance will be accepted for transmission. A Parcel must not contain another parcel or a Letter, or other postal packet intended for delivery to a person other than the addressee of the first named parcel.

Parcels containing Articles of an aggregate value exceeding £50 will not be accepted for transmission.

RE-DIRECTION OF PARCELS.

If a Parcel cannot be delivered as addressed, or is refused, the Sender, if his address be given on the parcel, will be communicated with by the Post Office as to the manner in which the parcel shall be disposed of.

If returned or re-directed from one Country to another, the parcel will be charged a full rate of postage.

UNDELIVERED PARCELS.

Parcels which cannot be delivered will be kept for a reasonable time before being finally disposed of.

PACKING OF PARCELS.

Parcels should be securely and substantially packed and closed by the Sender, and in some cases seals may be found necessary. If wax is used it should be of the special quality which resists tropical heat.

DELIVERY OF PARCELS IN TRINIDAD.
