THE following Resolution, which was adopted at the Meeting of the Legislative Council on the 3rd instant, is published for general information.

That this Council approves of the amendment, from this date, of the Customs Tariff, under Ordinance No. 18 of 1895, in the following details:—

- (1.) That the words "not exceeding 60 lbs." be read after the words "Bread of all kinds the barrel."
- (2.) That the items

Vermicelli (including Macaroni) the 100 lbs.	2s.
Candles—the 100 lbs.	2s. 2d.

 be read as if included in the Tariff in Section 3 of the Ordinance.
- (3.) That the following articles be read as if included in the list for drawback of duties in Section 4 of the Ordinance:—
 - (a.) Vermicelli (including Macaroni); and
 - (b.) Candles.
- (4.) That on the exportation of the following articles, manufactured in the Colony, if the Collector of Customs is satisfied that they have been made from imported materials; there shall be granted as drawback:—
 - (a.) On Hard Bread or Crackers per brl. of not less than 60 lbs 1s.
 - (b.) On Vermicelli (including Macaroni) the 100 lbs. ... 2s; and
 - (c.) On Candles, the 100 lbs. ... 2s. 2d.
- (5.) That Section 76 of the Principal Customs Ordinance be read as if the word "oil" had been inserted after the word "spirits" in the fourteenth line of such Section.
