POST OFFICE NOTICE.

NOTIFICATION has been received that many letters, ordinary and registered, for the interior of China are received at the British Post Office Agencies in China insufficiently prepaid at the penny rate. Such letters are transferred to the Chinese Post Office for onward transmission and delivery, and are surcharged by that Office double the deficient postage at the international rate.

In the circumstances the following facts concerning the correspondence for China which may be sent at the penny rate of postage is communicated for general information:—

British Post Office Agencies are maintained at

Amoy.
Canton.
Chefoo.
Foochow.
Hankow.

Hoihow.
Ningpo.
Shanghai.
Swatow and
Tientsin.

Penny postage is in force to these Agencies but applies only to letters delivered at the Agency itself to callers or within the restricted area of its delivery. The delivery area of the Agency at Amoy includes Kulangsu, that of the Canton Agency includes Honam, that of the Foochow Agency includes Nantai and that of the Hoihow Agency includes Kiungchow. As a general rule letters for Non-Chinese resident at any of these places may be accepted for transmission at the penny rate, but letters addressed to Chinese should be prepaid at the ordinary international rate unless the sender is sure that the addressee lives within the delivery area of the British Agency, or has made arrangements to call for his letters at the Agency.

Letters addressed to any one in the British Colony of Hong Kong or in the Leased Territory of Weihaiwei (Liu-Kung-tau) may be sent at the penny rate.

No. 150—"Fyzabad Road—Order made by the Governor in Executive Council under the Regulations relating to Main Roads of the 17th December, 1900, declaring the Fyzabad Local Road in the Ward of Oropuche to be a Main Road."

No. 151—"United British Oilfields of Trinidad, Ltd.—Oil Mining Lease—Lease of seven contiguous parcels of land in the Ward of La Brea and Guapo in the Oropuche Ward Union, containing in the aggregate 5,895 acres, 3 roods and 16 perches or thereabouts."
