**Regulations made by the Governor in Executive Council under the Post Office Ordinance, 1918.**

**EXCHANGE OF MONEY ORDERS BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND TRINIDAD.**

1. The following shall be inserted as No. 273a of the Postal Regulations made on the 16th September, 1914:—

273a.—Before a duplicate Postal Order issued in the United States of America is paid in this Colony, the payee shall sign the following agreement, and if the sum to be paid exceeds £5, shall affix a 6d. stamp to the Agreement and cancel the stamp by writing thereon his initials and the date:

“ I hereby acknowledge the receipt of the sum of... ..  
“ and I agree to refund to the Postmaster-General of Trinidad,  
“ the amount of the original order of which the particulars  
“ are shown in the Coupon of Duplicate Money Order  
“ attached hereto, should it have been already, or be at any  
“ time hereafter, presented and paid, of which presentation  
“ and payment the production of the said order purporting to  
“ be stamped with the date stamps of a paying office shall be  
“ sufficient evidence.

“ Signature.....”

2. No. 278 of the said Postal Regulations is hereby amended by striking out the words “ on the relative advices “ shall be impressed the amount in sterling money to be “ paid to the payee.”

SELLING PRICES OF STATIONERY EMBOSSED OR  
IMPRESSED WITH POSTAGE STAMPS.

1. Postal Regulation No. 1 made on the 1st day of June, 1922, is hereby revoked and the following shall be read as No. 30A of the Postal Regulations made on the 16th day of September, 1914:—

30A. On and from the 1st November, 1924, envelopes embossed with a stamp representing a registration fee of threepence, and postcards and newspaper wrappers impressed with a stamp representing the postage fee shall be retailed at the following respective prices:—

Large and small Registration Envelopes embossed with a threepenny stamp	...	..	4d. each
Postcards impressed with a penny stamp	...		1½d. each
Newspaper wrappers impressed with a ½d. stamp	...		1½d. for 2
Single wrappers being charged for at the rate of	...		¾d. each
Newspaper wrappers impressed with a penny stamp	...		2½d. for 2
Single wrappers being charged for at the rate of	...		1½d. each
