

**POST OFFICE NOTICE.**

**AIR MAIL SERVICES.**

1. Letters, postcards, printed papers, commercial papers and samples may be posted at any Post Office in the Colony for transmission by Air Mail.

2. An Air Mail packet can be accepted for registration but it cannot be insured.

3. Air Mail correspondence must be fully prepaid in stamps with ordinary postage stamps. If the Air Mail Fee is not fully prepaid the packet will not be forwarded by Air Mail. It will go forward by ordinary mail.

4. A special Air Mail label should be affixed to the top left hand corner of every Air Mail packet. These labels can be obtained free of charge at any Post Office in the Colony. If an Air Mail label is not available the packet should be clearly marked by the sender "**BY AIR MAIL.**"

### ACQUISITION OF WATER RIGHTS.

Notice under section 6 of the Land Acquisition Ordinance, Cap. 168.

POSTAL REGULATIONS.

Parcel post rates to Canada.

Regulation made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 72 (1) of the Post Office Ordinance, Cap 108, to amend Schedule A to the Postal Regulations, 1927.

In Schedule A to the Postal Regulations, 1927, the particulars referring to the Parcel Post Rates to Canada shall be deleted, and in lieu thereof shall be read:—

Canada --For each lb. or fraction of a lb. up to a maximum of 20 lb. .... 6d. per lb.
