POST OFFICE NOTICE.

AIR MAIL SERVICES.

- I. Letters, postcards, printed papers, commercial papers and samples may be posted at any post office in the Colony for transmission by Air Mail.
 - 2. An Air Mail packet can be accepted for registration but it cannot be insured.
- 3. Air Mail correspondence must be fully prepaid in stamps with ordinary postage stamps. If the Air Mail fee is not fully prepaid the packet will not be forwarded by Air Mail. It will go forward by ordinary mail.
- 4. A special Air Mail label should be affixed to the top left hand corner of every Air Mail packet. These labels can be obtained free of charge at any Post Office in the Colony. If an Air Mail label is not available the packet should be clearly marked by the sender "BY AIR MAIL."

POSTAL REGULATIONS.

Regulations made by the Governor in Executive Council under the Post Office Ordinance, Cap. 108.

SMALL PACKETS.

1. The following shall be inserted as Regulation 43a of the Postal Regulations, 1927:—

The prepaid rate of Postage on Small Packets for all places abroad

shall be :-

For the first 8 ounces or fraction thereof 6d.
For each additional 2 ounces or fraction thereof 1½d.

The maximum dimensions of small packets are 18 inches by 8 inches by 4 inches, or, if in the form of a roll, 18 inches in length by 6 inches in diameter.

The limit of weight is 2 lb.

Small packets are intended to afford facilities for the transmission of small articles of merchandise in the letter mails, and they may be sent to such places as are mentioned in the London Postal Guide under the heading "Small Packets."

Dutiable articles may be enclosed in small packets; but otherwise the prohibitions applicable to the letter post apply also to the service of small packets. In addition, the following are specially excluded from

transmission in small packets:-

Letters, notes or documents having the character of actual and personal correspondence (this prohibition does not apply to open invoices, reduced to the simplest form, the address of the article, and the sender's address); coin; bank notes; currency notes; negotiable instruments payable to bearer; platinum, gold or silver manufactured or not; precious stones; jewels and other valuable articles; postage stamps, whether obliterated or not.

Small packets containing dutiable articles are subject to the Customs regulations in the country of destination; and a postal fee for Customs clearance may be charged on each packet on which Customs Duty is levied. The fee for the clearance of such packets entering this country

is fixed at 3d.

Small packets are subject to the regulations laid down for samples of merchandise as regards form, make up and packing (e.g., they must be sent in such manner as to be easy of examination). In addition, the name and address of the sender must be shown on the outside of the packet, and each packet should be conspicuously marked: "Small Packet" in the left hand top corner.

A green label giving particulars of the contents for Customs purposes, such as that already used on letter packets containing dutiable articles for places abroad must be affixed to the address side of each packet; and in addition, if the country of destination so requires, one or more ordinary non-adhesive Customs Declaration Forms must be enclosed in, or

attached to, the packet.

Small packets may be posted in a posting box or handed over the counter. They may be registered, but not insured.

POSTAGE ON LITERATURE FOR THE BLIND.

2. No. 44 of the Postal Regulations, 1927, is hereby revoked, and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—

44. Papers of any kind, periodicals and books impressed in "Braille" or other special type, for the use of the Blind, may be sent prepaid, by Inland Post or to any place abroad up to a maximum weight of II lb. at the following rates:—

55b. Except where otherwise provided for, a fee of 3d. is payable on every postal packet received from abroad upon which Customs Duty is levied.

RATES OF POSTAGE WITH THE BRITISH EMPIRE AND FOREIGN COUNTRIES.

- 1. Regulation No. 9 of the Postal Regulations, 1927, and the Regulations made on 25th October, 1928, are hereby revoked, and the following shall be inserted in the Postal Regulations, 1927, as Regulation No. 9:—
 - 9. (a) The prepaid rate of postage on letters to the United Kingdom, other parts of the British Empire, including mandated Territories (except Iraq and Trans-Jordan), Egypt, and the British Post Office at Tangier, shall be:—

For the first ounce or fraction thereof ... $1\frac{1}{2}d$. For each additional ounce or fraction thereof... 1d.

(b) The rate to all other places abroad, including the mandated Territories of Iraq and Trans-Jordan, the United States of America, the United States Virgin Islands, Porto Rico, Alaska, Hawaii, and the Canal Zone shall be:—

For the first ounce or fraction thereof ... 3d. For each additional ounce or fraction thereof... 14d.

2. This Regulation shall take effect on and after the 1st day of January, 1932.
