POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANK.

Regulations made by the Governor under Section 36 of the Savings Bank Ordinance, Cap. 109.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Savings Bank Regulations 1933.
- 2. The Savings Bank Branch of the General Post Office in Port-of-House of Spain shall be open for the receipt and payment of deposits, and for the business transaction of Savings Bank business generally, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on week days, with the exception of Saturday, when the hours for the transaction of Savings Bank business will be from 9 a.m. to 12 noon.

At all sub-Post Offices the hours shall be fixed by the Postmaster-General, and a notice giving this information shall be posted up at each office.

Savings Bank business will not be transacted on Sundays or Public Holidays.

DEPOSITS.

- Deposits shall be made on the form provided by the Postmaster- Forms for deposits.
- 4. At the time of each deposit, other than a first deposit, Depositor to the Depositor shall present his depositor's book, and the necessary entry present his shall then be made therein by an officer appointed to conduct Savings when making a deposit.
- 5. Each deposit shall be entered in the Depositor's book in words Deposits to be entered in words and figures.
- 6. Any depositor being unable to attend in person may deposit l'eposits may by another person, who shall fill up and sign on his behalf the be made by a person other necessary voucher.
- 7. When a first deposit is made under Section 12 of Cap. 109 a Peposits by declaration shall be made by the Depositor on the form provided by the Trustees. Postmaster-General.

WITHDRAWALS.

- 8. Withdrawals shall be made on the form provided by the Forms-Postmaster-General.
- 9. Subject to the provisions of 12 of these Regulations, a Withdrawals. depositor who has opened an account at the General Post Office, Port-of-Spain, the Post Office, San Fernando, or the Post Office,

Scarborough, may withdraw any portion of his deposit from such account at the office at which the account was opened. Such withdrawal shall be made on the form provided by the Postmaster-General.

10. A depositor wishing to withdraw any portion of his deposit at any Savings Bank Post Office other than the General Post Office Port-of-Spain, the Post Office San Fernando, or the Post Office Scarborough, shall fill up and sign the form provided by the Postmaster-General. The notice when filled up shall be forwarded by the Depositor to the Postmaster-General, free of postage.

Issue of Warrant,

11. Upon receipt of a notice of withdrawal, the Postmaster-General or any other officer appointed for the purpose, shall, if the notice is correct in all respects and signed, issue a warrant for the amount. Such warrant shall be according to the form provided by the Postmaster-General. The warrant shall be sent by post.

Limit of amount to be withdrawn.

12. No application for withdrawal may be made of a less amount than one shilling, but a depositor may at any time apply to withdraw the whole amount deposited together with the interest due upon his deposits.

Withdrawals.

13. Withdrawals under regulations 9, 10 and 12 shall be subject to the provisions of Section 13 of Cap. 109.

Notice to be given when withdrawals exceed £500.

14. A depositor wishing to withdraw any sum exceeding £500 but not exceeding £1,000 shall give such notice not exceeding fifteen days, as the Postmaster-General may require. One month's notice shall be given for the withdrawal of any sum exceeding £1,000.

Depositor resident abroad.

15. If a depositor be resident abroad, his signature to a withdrawal voucher must be verified by some constituted authority of the place in which he is residing, to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General, before payment can be made. When he is residing in a foreign country, the signature of the British Minister or Consul, stamped with the Stamp of Office will be required. The signature of the person presenting the receipted voucher as witness to the payment is also required.

DEPOSITOR'S BOOK.

Depositor's book.

16. If any depositor shall lose his depositor's book and should desire a new book, he must apply to the Postmaster-General, stating the circumstances of the loss, and on the issue of a new book a charge of sixpence, together with the cost of any notice respecting such loss shall be made.

Deposit book to be forwarded to the Postmaster-General when required. 17. Every depositor shall, whenever he is required to do so, send his depositor's book to the Postmaster-General through the post free of charge in a cover or envelope to be obtained at any Money Order Office in the Colony.

Deposit book to be the property of the the Postmaster-General, and shall be delivered to him as and when Postmaster-General.

18. Every depositor's book shall be deemed to be the property of the Postmaster-General, and shall be delivered to him as and when required by the Postmaster-General.

TRANSFER OF DEPOSITS.

19. An application from a depositor to transfer his account from the Transfer of Trinidad Post Office Savings Bank to a Post Office Savings Bank in the account to or from Post United Kingdom shall be made in triplicate on the form provided by Office Savings the Postmaster-General which may be obtained at the General Post Office Bank in the United in Port-of-Spain and shall be accompanied by the Depositor's Book, Kingdom. , and such evidence of the applicant's identity as the Postmaster-General may require.

- 20. The amount to be transferred shall be transmitted to the Transfer to Postmaster-General in London by the earliest opportunity after the United Kingdom. receipt of the application.
- 21. Unless the applicant has been a depositor in the Post Office Savings Bank for a period of three months such depositor is not entitled to effect a transfer.
- 22. In the case of a transfer from the United Kingdom to the Transfer from Trinidad Post Office Savings Bank, the Postmaster-General, shall open Kingdom. an account in accordance with the transfer papers relating thereto, a depositor's book being issued to the Depositor after the Postmaster-General has satisfied himself as to the identity of the depositor, and the rules applicable to the making of a first deposit shall be observed.

When an account already exists in favour of the depositor, the latter shall produce his depositor's book in order that the amount transferred may be credited therein.

23. The Savings Bank Regulations made by the Governor on Repeal. 14th December, 1918 are hereby revoked.

POST OFFICE NOTICE.

AIR MAIL SERVICES.

- 1. Letters, postcards, printed papers, commercial papers and samples may be posted at any post office in the Colony for transmission by Air Mail.
 - 2. An Air Mail packet can be accepted for registration but it cannot be insured.
- 3. Air Mail correspondence must be fully prepaid in stamps with ordinary postage stamps. If the Air Mail fee is not fully prepaid the packet will not be forwarded by Air Mail. It will go forward by ordinary mail.
- 4. A special Air Mail label should be affixed to the top left hand corner of every Air Mail packet. These labels can be obtained free of charge at any Post Office in the Colony. If an Air Mail label is not available the packet should be clearly marked by the sender "BY AIR MAIL."
- 5. The prepaid Air Rate on any kind of packet, that is, letters, postcards, printed papers, commercial papers and samples is as follows:—
