AIR MAIL SERVICES.

1. Letters, postcards, printed papers, commercial papers and samples may be posted at any post office in the Colony for transmission by Air Mail.

2. An Air Mail packet can be accepted for registration but it cannot be insured.

3. Air Mail correspondence must be fully prepaid in stamps with ordinary postage stamps. If the Air Mail fee is not fully prepaid the packet will not be forwarded by Air Mail. It will go forward by ordinary mail.

4. A special Air Mail label should be affixed to the top left hand corner of every Air Mail packet. These labels can be obtained free of charge at any Post Office in the Colony. If an Air Mail label is not available the packet should be clearly marked by the sender "**BY AIR MAIL**".

5. The prepaid Air Rate on any kind of packet, that is, letters, postcards, printed papers, commercial papers and samples is as follows:—
