POST OFFICE—AIR MAIL SERVICES

LETTERS, postcards, printed papers, commercial papers and samples may be posted at any Post Office in the Colony for transmission by Air Mail.

An Air Mail packet can be accepted for registration but cannot be insured.

Air Mail correspondence must be fully prepaid by affixing postage stamps to the packet.

A special Air Mail label should be affixed to the top left hand corner of every Air Mail packet. These labels can be obtained free of charge at any Post Office in the Colony. If an Air Mail label is not available the packet should be clearly marked by the sender "BY AIR MAIL".

Special Air Letter Forms are available at Post Offices in the Colony for communicating with countries in the British Empire. No enclosures of any kind are permitted. If anything is enclosed the letter will be sent by Ordinary Mail. Air Letter Forms cannot be registered.

POSTAGE STAMPS

The stamps are to be of similar size to those at present in use, with an inset of the King's head, and must be inscribed with the name of the Colony in full, and with the value in figures.

Entries will be judged primarily on their suitability and attractiveness as postage stamp designs, but consideration will be given to their merit as incidental advertising of the Colony's resources and attractions.

A prize of \$20.00 will be awarded for each design which is accepted. Where photographs are submitted they should be accompanied by the photographic negative.

Designs should be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary not later than 1st August, 1947.

Any design which is accepted, and any photographic negative or other material relating to it, will become the absolute property of the Government of Trinidad and Tobago. The Government does not accept liability for loss of or damage to any design, though every care will be taken; and while every effort will be made to return designs which are not accepted, no guarantee will be given that this will be done.

BRITISH INTERESTS AFFECTED BY NATIONALISATION IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA AND POLAND

1. The question of claims for compensation to be awarded to British owners of property which may be affected by the recent nationalisation measures in Czechoslovakia and Poland has been the subject of exchanges between His Majesty's Government and the Governments of those countries. His Majesty's Government are now willing to represent such claims to the Governments of Czechoslovakia and Poland.

In addition, His Majesty's Government are willing to receive and forward claims for War Loss and Damage which will be considered by the Polish War Compensation Office.

2. In order to assist the United Kingdom Representative in making and pursuing these claims, a Register of British property rights and interests in Czechoslovakia and Poland is being established. Accordingly, persons having any assets in those countries should register them in accordance with the following arrangements in order to facilitate such action as may be possible in their interests. Poland covers the territories at present being administered by the Government of the Republic of Poland.

3. Registration will be accepted from

(i) bodies of persons incorporated or constituted in the United Kingdom (including the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man); and

(ii) British subjects whose normal place of residence is

(a) in the United Kingdom,

(b) elsewhere if facilities for registration are not available locally.

4. These arrangements relate to assets of the following classes:—

(a) Immovable property (premises of all kinds, whether for business or residential purposes);

(b) Movable property (machinery, goods, furniture, &c.);

(c) Rights and interests in property (mortgages, &c.);

(d) Claims of a monetary nature such as commercial debts, bank balances, &c.;

(e) Stocks, shares, debentures, securities, &c., other than those issued by State and Municipal authorities.

5. The Government of Trinidad and Tobago is prepared to forward claims from any persons in the Colony entitled to register a claim under the arrangements described above and any such persons should submit their claims to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st day of July, 1947.
