Gentlemen,

I am directed by the Minister to refer to correspondence which you have had with the Postmaster General of this Colony on the subject of the recent issue of an overprint postage stamp.

(2) Postage stamps are obtained from the Crown Agents and supplies are indented for as needed. In the early part of December last year it was discovered that an outstanding indent balance of 1½ millions one-cent stamps was overdue and there was a danger that local stocks of that denomination might be exhausted before replenishment. The Crown Agents were immediately communicated with by cable and they proceeded to expedite the dispatch of the wanted denomination. When stocks dropped to a dangerously low level it was decided to make a local overprint of the two-cent denomination in order to meet the public demand but it was hoped to avoid their issue by redistributing stocks throughout the various post offices in the colony.

(3) Eventually, however, because of a delay of 24 hours caused by engine trouble in the arrival of a British West Indian Airways aircraft from New York bearing a consignment of stamps it became necessary to sell the overprint on the 20th December, 1956.

(4) The overprint was put on sale at the Headquarters Office in the Port of Spain only and after a short buying flutter sales were restricted to 120 stamps per person. The issue was on sale for one day only.

(5) A total of 539,940 two-cent stamps were overprinted by the Government Printer at Port of Spain. Of these, 81,840 were sold to the public on 20th December, 379 retained for official records and the balance of 457,721 were destroyed on the 19th February, 1957.

THE POST OFFICE ORDINANCE, CH. 36. NO. 1

REGULATIONS

MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL UNDER SECTION 71 OF THE
POST OFFICE ORDINANCE

THE POST OFFICE (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1957

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1957, and shall be read as one with the Post Office Regulations hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. Regulation 175 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended :—

- (a) by deleting the word "and" immediately after the word "twenty" occurring in the fourth line thereof and substituting therefor a comma; and

(b) by inserting immediately after the word "twenty-one" occurring in the fourth line thereof the words "and forty".

3. The following regulation is hereby substituted for regulation 176 of the Principal Regulations :—

"176. British Postal Orders shall be subject to charges for poundage as follows :—

For each order from sixpence to one shilling	...	8 cents
For each order from one shilling and sixpence to twenty-one shillings	10 cents
For each order of forty shillings	18 cents."

RESOLUTION

CUSTOMS ORDINANCE, CH. 32. No. 2

RESOLVED : That this Council, in accordance with the provisions of section 49A of the Customs Ordinance as enacted by the Customs (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951-1953, approves the exemptions from the payment of import duties of customs on the classes of goods specified in the second column of the Appendix hereto imported for the respective purposes specified in the third column of the said Appendix during the periods terminating not later than the respective dates prescribed in the fourth column of the said Appendix as the last dates on which such exemptions shall be granted.

THE POST OFFICE ORDINANCE, CH. 36. No. 1.

REGULATIONS

MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL UNDER SECTION 71 OF THE
POST OFFICE ORDINANCE, CH. 36. No. 1.

THE POST OFFICE (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1957

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1957, and shall be read as one with the Post Office Regulations, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

(2) Except as otherwise provided herein these Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1958.

2. Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by inserting the following definition as paragraph (19) thereof:—

"(19) The expression "Article for the Blind" means a packet containing books and papers impressed or intended to be impressed in 'Braille' or other special type or any article specially adapted for the use of the blind."

3. Regulation 11 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and replaced by the following:—

^{"Inland postage rates"} 11. (1) There shall be charged and paid on postal packets other than Articles for the Blind addressed to any place in the Colony the following rates of postage:—

- (i) On every letter:—
 - (a) not exceeding one ounce in weight, five cents;
 - (b) exceeding one ounce in weight, five cents for the first ounce and two cents for every ounce or fractional part of an ounce in excess.
- (ii) On every postcard, four cents;
- (iii) On every printed paper or commercial paper packet, two cents for every two ounces or fractional part of two ounces;
- (iv) On every sample packet, two cents for every two ounces or fractional part of two ounces.

(2) No postage shall be paid on Articles for the Blind."

4. (1) Paragraph (1) of regulation 12 of the Principal Regulations, as enacted by the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1952-1953, is hereby revoked and replaced by the following:—

^{"Postage rates to places outside the Colony."} (1) There shall be charged and paid on postal packets addressed to places outside the Colony the following rates of postage:—

- (i) On every British letter:—
 - (a) not exceeding one ounce in weight, six cents;
 - (b) exceeding one ounce, six cents for the first ounce and three cents for every ounce or fractional part of an ounce in excess.

- (ii) On every other outgoing letter:—
 - (a) not exceeding one ounce in weight, twelve cents;
 - (b) exceeding one ounce in weight, twelve cents for the first ounce and eight cents for every ounce or fractional part of an ounce in excess.
- (iii) On every British postcard:—
 - (a) other than a reply postcard, five cents;
 - (b) reply postcard, ten cents.
- (iv) On every other outgoing postcard:—
 - (a) other than a reply postcard, eight cents;
 - (b) reply postcard, sixteen cents.
- (v) On every printed paper packet:—
 - (a) not exceeding two ounces in weight, five cents;
 - (b) exceeding two ounces in weight, five cents for the first two ounces and two cents for every two ounces or fractional part of two ounces in excess.
- (vi) On every commercial paper packet:—
 - (a) not exceeding twelve ounces in weight, fifteen cents;
 - (b) exceeding twelve ounces in weight, fifteen cents for the first twelve ounces and two cents for each additional two ounces or fractional part of two ounces in excess.
- (vii) On every sample packet:—
 - (a) not exceeding four ounces in weight, five cents;
 - (b) exceeding four ounces in weight, five cents for the first four ounces and two cents for every two ounces or fractional part of two ounces in excess.
- (viii) On every small packet addressed to any country or place with which the Postmaster General may for the time being have an arrangement for the exchange of small packets:—
 - (a) not exceeding ten ounces in weight, twenty-five cents;
 - (b) exceeding ten ounces in weight, twenty-five cents for the first ten ounces and five cents for every two ounces or fractional part of two ounces in excess.
- (ix) On every insured box addressed to any country or place with which the Postmaster General may for the time being have an arrangement for the exchange of insured boxes:—
 - (a) not exceeding ten ounces in weight, fifty cents;
 - (b) exceeding ten ounces in weight, fifty cents for the first ten ounces and ten cents for every two ounces or fractional part of two ounces in excess.

(2) This Regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of

April, 1958.

5. The first three lines of regulation 22 of the Principal Regulations are hereby deleted and in place thereof the following shall have effect:—

“Postal packets intended for transmission as Articles for the Blind shall—

(i) consist only of Articles for the Blind, and may”.

6. Regulation 27 of the Principal Regulations as amended by the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1952-1953, is hereby amended by substituting the words “thirty cents” for the figures and word “16 cents” appearing therein.

7. Regulation 34 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended—

(a) in paragraph (2) by substituting the words “two cents” for the words “one cent” appearing therein; and

(b) in paragraph (4), as enacted by the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1952-1953, by substituting the words “ten cents” and “fifteen cents” respectively for the words “eight cents” and “twelve cents” appearing therein.

8. Regulation 35 of the Principal Regulations, as enacted by the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1952-1953, is hereby revoked and replaced by the following:—

“Stamped stationery.

35. Registered letter envelopes, postcards and newspaper wrappers shall be issued at all Post Offices in the Colony for sale to the public at the following prices:—

Registered envelopes with registration fee of fifteen cents paid twenty cents each.

Postcards impressed with a two cent stamp three cents each

Newspaper wrappers impressed with a two cent stamp three cents each”

9. Regulation 36 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and replaced by the following:—

“Rates for inland parcels.

36. The rates of postage on inland parcels shall be as follows:—

(a) not exceeding one pound in weight, twenty cents;

(b) exceeding one pound in weight, twenty cents for the first one pound and five cents for every pound or fractional part of a pound in excess.”

10. Regulation 37 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by substituting the words “twenty-two pounds” for the word “eleven pounds” appearing therein.

11. (1) Regulation 47A of the Principal Regulations, as enacted by the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1952-1953, is hereby revoked and replaced by the following:—

“Rates for outgoing airmail parcels

47A. There shall be charged and paid on outgoing airmail parcels the rates of postage as set out in the Second Schedule to these Regulations in addition to the appropriate air surcharge set out in the Ninth Schedule to these Regulations.”

(2) This Regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of April, 1958.

12. Regulation 77 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked.

13. Regulation 80 of the Principal Regulations, as amended by the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1952-1953, is hereby amended by substituting the words "fifteen cents" for the words "eight cents" appearing therein.

14. Regulation 81 of the Principal Regulations, as amended by the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1952-1953, is hereby amended by substituting the words "ten cents" for the word "eight cents", the words "fifteen cents" for the words "twelve cents" and the words "twenty cents" for the words "sixteen cents" appearing therein.

15. Regulation 82 of the Principal Regulations, as amended by the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1952-1953, is hereby amended by substituting the words "thirty cents" for the figures and word "sixteen cents" appearing therein.

16. Sub-paragraph (b) of regulation 90 (2) (i) of the Principal Regulations, as amended by the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1952-1953, is hereby amended by substituting the words "thirty cents" for the word "sixteen cents" appearing therein.

17. The following regulation is hereby inserted in the Principal Regulations immediately after regulation 110:—

^{"Demurrage fee on incoming parcels.} 110A. Within fourteen days after the date of notice of arrival of a foreign incoming parcel served on him, any addressee of such parcel who fails to clear it from the Post Office shall be liable to pay a demurrage fee of five cents per parcel per day during the period the parcel remains at the Post Office in excess of the fourteen days: Provided that the Postmaster General, in his discretion, may waive collection of this fee."

18. Sub-paragraph (b) of regulation 111 of the Principal Regulations, as enacted by the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1952-1953, is hereby revoked and replaced by the following:—

"(b) The annual rent shall be:

Large boxes	\$20.00
Medium boxes	\$15.00
Small boxes	\$10.00."

19. Regulation 122 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by substituting the figures "\$20.00" for the figures "\$12.00" and the figures "\$2.00" for the figures "\$1.20" appearing therein.

20. Regulation 123 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by substituting the words "as prescribed by the Convention of the Universal Postal Union" for the words and figures "of 12 cents each" appearing therein.

21. Regulation 124 of the Principal Regulations, as amended by the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1952-1953, is hereby revoked and replaced by the following:—

^{"Exchange for stamps.} 124. International Reply Coupons issued in other countries may be exchanged at any Money Order Office in the Colony for a stamp or stamps representing the surface postage payable on a single rate unregistered letter to a foreign country."

22. (1) Regulations 125 and 126 of the Principal Regulations are hereby revoked and replaced by the following:—

“Commonwealth reply coupons. 125. Commonwealth reply coupons valid within the British Commonwealth only shall be sold at any Money Order Office in the Colony at the price of eight cents each.

Exchange for stamps. 126. Commonwealth reply coupons may be exchanged at any Money Order Office in the Colony for a stamp or stamps representing the postage payable on a single rate unregistered surface letter to a British Commonwealth country.”

(2) Regulation 125 as replaced by this Regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of April, 1958.

23. Regulation 176 of the Principal Regulations, as enacted by the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1952-1953, is hereby revoked and replaced by the following:—

“Poundage payable. 176. British Postal Orders shall be subject to charges for poundage as follows:—

For each order from six pence to one shilling	...	8 cents
For each order from one shilling and six pence to twenty-one shillings	...	10 cents
For each order of forty shillings	...	18 cents

24. The First Schedule to the Principal Regulations as enacted by the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1952-1953, is hereby amended:—

(a) by deleting the following countries and places:—

- “Burma
- Egypt and Anglo-Egyptian Sudan
- Jordan
- Morocco: British Post Office at Tangier
- Palestine—all areas
- Tibet (Indian Agencies)
- Gold Coast including British Togoland”;

(b) by inserting the country “Ghana” between the country “Gambia” and the country “Gibraltar”.

25. (1) The Second Schedule to the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and replaced by the following:—
